- Vehicles and tanks for the purpose of potable water cartage must meet Department of Health Regulations & Standards
- Upon request by Council Officers, Water Carter vehicles and tanks must be presented for inspection
- Works on private water systems, including all pipe works shall be carried out in accordance with AS 3500 Plumbing and Drainage 2012 and NSW Code of Practice for Plumbing and Drainage 3rd Edition 2006 by a licensed plumber.
- Activities that result in run-off water entering any stormwater systems may incur penalties associated with pollution as defined under the Protection of the Environment Operations [POEO] Act 1997.
