

Reasons a relocation may be required



Unavailability of the Original Venue

If the originally booked venue becomes unavailable due to maintenance, construction, or an unexpected closure, relocation is often necessary.

Last-Minute Repairs or Maintenance

Unexpected maintenance or repairs in the booked space may necessitate a change in location to avoid disruption.

Weather-Related Issues

Outdoor events may need to be relocated due to adverse weather conditions, such as heavy rain or extreme heat, to ensure attendee safety and event success.

Scheduling Conflicts

Double bookings or administrative scheduling conflicts may require a relocation to accommodate all parties.

Increased Attendance

If an event's attendance exceeds the capacity of the originally booked venue, a larger space may be allocated to accommodate everyone.

Community Needs and Priorities

If a higher-priority community event requires the originally booked venue, council may ask the initial event to relocate to a comparable space.

Safety Concerns

Health or safety concerns, such as an area's temporary closure due to environmental hazards or infrastructure issues, might prompt relocation.

Accessibility Requirements

If an attendee's accessibility needs aren't met by the originally booked venue, council may approve a relocation to ensure inclusive access.

Technical Requirements

If the event requires specific facilities or technical resources not available at the originally booked venue, a relocation may be arranged.

Improving Event Flow or Traffic Management

In cases where another location may better support traffic flow or attendee movement, council may relocate the event.

Accommodating Multiple Events

During high-demand periods, council may relocate
